based pamphlets to be shared with the women in iail and prison. Some of the pamphlets include, "How to Make lesus Your Best Friend," "Hope" and "Faith Builders." The pamphlets are bundled in packages of 3 or 4 and are given to women at CIW. Puerto La Cruz, upon release from iail, and to inmates at Donavon.




